From Albuquerque with Love

Delegates Report of the 2011 World Service Business Conference April 27 through April 30, 2011 in Albuquerque, New Mexico

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to serve as a delegate to the 50th World Service Business Conference of Overeaters Anonymous.

I would like to give some background information about the annual business conference. The 2011 conference had 180+ voting members, comprised of 16 trustees and about 170 delegates and 2 alternates. We were from ten regions all over the world. We sat by region and rotated positions at the tables at each session. Lucy and I, being from Texas, sat with delegates from Region 3, which includes Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Utah and Outstates Intergroup (Scottsbluff, Nebraska and Torrington, Wyoming). Our Region 3 had the largest percentage of intergroups represented.

The business sessions encompassed three days, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Sessions began at 8 a.m. and, minus lunch break, lasted until late afternoon.

All delegates are assigned to a World Service committee on which they serve for a One of the trustees also serves on each committee. I was assigned to the year. Web/Technical Committee. Most of these committees meet two or three times at conference (before and after the business sessions). There are regular OA meetings and workshops

sandwiched in also, but we found we had very little time to attend those.

I will let Lucy share with you about what votes were taken during the business sessions. I have three very important highlights to share with you: (1) I met and chatted with the lovely lady from nearby Abilene, Texas, who

is our Region 3 trustee. She is available to come and be our keynote speaker at our annual November retreat at Glen Rose; (2) I met and exchanged email addresses with a delegate from the Dallas Metro I.G. that should facilitate communications between our two intergroups; and (3) Being on the web/tech. committee on the world service level could be an asset for us in the future, as it may be possible in the future to tie in with OA World Service website and save us some money. The Web/Tech. committee is having Skype conference calls on a monthly basis to map out and implement plans for assisting intergroups worldwide in establishing and maintaining their individual websites with our help. This is a work in progress. I'll keep you posted on the work of this committee.

I had hoped we would visit the World Service Office in nearby Rio Rancho, NM, but no trip was scheduled. Also, I had hoped to see Rozanne S., O.A. founder, with whom I served in the 80's on the International Committee. She was not well enough to attend. This conference officially voted to call her our founder, and a call was made to inform her of our decision.
