

During the early years a line-by-line reading and re-reading of the AA Big Book helped to build a loyal following, and after the second read-through of the Big Book, other OA and AA literature were introduced to bring about some variety.

Growth was good at the Millwood location but time and the needs of the host rehabilitation center brought on mounting challenges. Coming in to find no room available and even having to go the nearest Starbucks to hold the meeting began to challenge the serenity so greatly sought in the meeting. When meetings were moved to the facility's cafeteria at dinner preparation time, it became apparent that change was in order.

Like all other OA traditions, they shook off the fear and moved ahead one step at a time. A search for a new facility was started and in the spring of 2011 the meeting was moved to its new location at Pantego Bible Church - the right space and atmosphere for the group to grow and flourish.

Even here, growing pains mark the measurement of their resolve. The first rooms provided were inundated with youth programs and little in the way of tranquility. Then the Church allowed them to move up to the main building where the rooms are wonderful but the main doors are locked so a doorperson and a phone link needed to be instituted. The move has changed attendance but the core of the group and a continuing influx of new members seeking a solution will do what time and perseverance did five years ago - grow and nurture this meeting place of abstinence.
