It Works If We Work It Together

Tradition 5: Each group has but one primary purpose - to carry its message to the compulsive overeater who still suffers.

"The compulsive overeater who still suffers isn't always a newcomer to OA. He or she can also be an established member experiencing difficulties with the disease of compulsive eating or with other problems." OA 12 & 12 p. 148

This past year, I started to call a fellow OAer who was very happy, joyous and free, who was abstinent and working on Steps 8 and 9. We had good talks, nice and short, but also deep. And then one day she told me that she wanted to talk about food. So we did. Another day she told me she was not willing to weigh and measure and that instead she might eliminate certain foods. Then I didn't catch her for a week and when I spoke to her again, she had relapsed. She had decided to make the changes and knowing this, she went on a spree that turned into full blown relapse. I kept calling her, kept leaving messages even when she was not there. I don't remember what I said to her on the phone calls before her relapse, probably that I weigh and measure most of my meals but not all; that I eat the foods that she wanted to eliminate, and I'm grateful for my abstinence and my plan of eating. After her relapse I may have listened to her more than spoken. I don't know if the calls helped or not. I do know that I was committed to calling her, no matter what. The relapse got stronger before, by the grace of HP, she regained her abstinence.

I must admit that it was harder for me to call her when she was struggling. But thank HP I still did because I'm learning more and more that her recovery is tied to my own, that all of our recoveries are interdependent on our reliance on HP and on each other. Although my sponsor has told me many times, relapse isn't contagious and recovery is. I have to admit that I am highly suggestible. I've now uncovered that I had a big slip soon after I learned of her relapse. And during my first couple weeks in OA, when my sponsor said to me, "We're liars", I heard it loud and clear and was offended. But, like clockwork, I lied to her the next day about the ingredients listed on a bag of something I wanted to eat. I'm glad that I can laugh about it now; it wasn't funny then. This might sound like I'm sharing someone else's story, but in fact, I'm uncovering something about my recovery and my relationship to the OA fellowship. I maintain my abstinence not only so I will live a better life, but more importantly so I can help others. HP knows we're not alone and it works if we work it, together!
